YOUTH SPONSORSHIP

Welcome to Norfolk Naval Shipyard. This booklet is a guide to help you learn about the surrounding area and to give insight into the youth programs we offer.

The Youth Sponsorship Program Component is required by law (Section 1785 of Title 10, United States Code) and specified within the Department of Defense Youth Instruction 6060.4 and OPNAVINST 1700.9E. The Youth Sponsorship Program consists of three major components:

Outreach: Identifying incoming youth and providing them with information and opportunities before they arrive.

Newcomer Orientation: Providing information and materials on programs and services available on the installation and in the surrounding community.

Peer to Peer: Connecting youth currently attached to the installation with incoming youth.

The Youth Sponsorship program is designed to assist young people in making the transition from one installation to another successfully. It is our goal to help incoming youth adjust and get connected with a youth ambassador at the installation. Youth Ambassadors will provide information about area schools, attractions and the surrounding community. This program is created by and for youth with youth involvement in every aspect of the program.

If you are new to the area and are looking for a place where you can meet other youth your age and have fun, then come check out our Youth Center at Norfolk Naval Shipyard! We have an environment that is specifically designed for you. Come and enjoy a place that offers School Age Care, Summer Camps as well as Sports and Fitness programs. Our Youth Center offers a variety of activities such as field trips, bowling, swimming and special events. You can get homework support and develop educational goals that will enhance the skills you will need for college and career readiness. Our Youth Programs are all fully accredited with the National After School Alliance (NAA).

We also have programs that are completely FREE for youth ages nine to 18 years old. These programs are designed to help you build character and develop leadership skills that will assist you in becoming a more resilient, dedicated and confident person through events such as community service. We offer all of these wonderful things and so much more!

Lastly, we have our Anchored4Life Club and Youth Sponsorship Program which will connect you with a Team Leader, Crew Member or Youth Ambassador who will help you become familiar with your new center, new school and community. These programs offer positive support, encouragement and life skills that will help you have a smooth move.

NNSY Youth Programs are open to all eligible family members of active duty, DoD civilians and retirees. We have great fun here and are always open and welcoming to new members.

Youth Center Programming

Our centers are member affiliates of 4-H and BGCA programs. Activities within these programs may vary, so please feel free to call to receive more information.

1. SCHOOL AGE CARE (BEFORE AND AFTER)

We offer a kindergarten, before and after school care program during the school year. These programs are quality care programs structured at a recreational setting that offers a variety of activities. Your child will experience various arts and crafts activities, sports, games, plus visit other MWR facilities. These will include the base movie theater, library and bowling center. Our facilities also offer Boys & Girls Clubs of America (BGCA) and 4-H programs. Please see affiliated programs for more information. Please see schools for a listing that we provide transportation to.

- Kindergarten Care children must be five years old and enrolled in school to qualify for the program.
- Before and After Care children must be between six and 12 years old and enrolled in school to qualify for the program.

2. SUMMER CAMP

During the summer months, an 11-week activity camp is offered for youth six to 12 years. This is another quality care program that is designed to offer a recreation setting with a variety of activities that include arts and crafts, sports, games and other recreational fun. Your child will also visit other MWR facilities like the base movie theater, library, swimming pools and bowling center as well as many off-base field trips. Please check with your local center for more information on the camp.

Fees for the above youth programs are:

- Priority registration is in effect
- A sliding scale is used based upon your total family income.
- Weekly payments (Summer) / Bi-Monthly (SAC)

Eligibility for the above youth programs are: Children of active duty military personnel, Department of Defense (DoD) civilian personnel paid from either appropriated or non-appropriated funds, reservists on active duty and DoD contractors.

3. YOUTH & TEEN OPEN RECREATION

A free Youth Open Recreation program for ages nine to 12 is targeted for the pre-teens. Also, a free Teen Open Recreation program for ages 13 to 18 (18-year-olds must be enrolled in high school), is targeted for teenagers. These programs are operated for the purpose of providing pre-teens and teens in the community with opportunities to enjoy social recreation activities, while offering guidance and meaningful experiences. All on and off-base field trip funds will need to be provided.

Eligible members include: Children of active duty military personnel, Department of Defense (DoD) civilian personnel paid from either appropriated or non-appropriated funds, reservists on active duty, DoD contractors and retirees.

4. SPORTS PROGRAMS

The Navy Youth Sports and Fitness (YSF) is dedicated to initiating and enhancing lifetime fitness for youth by providing consistent, safe, fun and developmentally-appropriate programming around youth sports, fitness, health/nutrition, outdoor recreation and motor skills development. Through the Navy's partnership with Navy National Alliance for Youth Sports (NAYS), programs benefit from a broad range of training and orientation programs, tools, support and materials. NAYS believe youth can be positively impacted by participation in sports and physical activities in the adults (staff and coaches) involved have participated in proper training and extensive background checks. Registration fees apply. (Some sports and ages may vary base to base, so please check with your local center for more information.)

5. DEFY PROGRAM

The DEFY Program is sponsored by the Secretary of the Navy Drug Reduction Task Force. Command sponsorship within the Mid-Atlantic Region is through Child and Youth Programs.

DEFY is a two-phased prevention program for children nine to 12 years old. DEFY deters "at risk" behaviors by giving children the tools they need to resist drugs, gangs and alcohol. The leadership and life skills provided by DEFY include goal-setting, team-building, conflict resolution and decision-making. Phase one is a structured eight-day leadership camp that occurs during the summer. Phase two is a school-year mentoring phase involving regularly scheduled activities where mentors and children have the opportunity to interact together. KEYSTONE CLUB & TORCH CLUB

The Keystone Club is a dynamic teen program that offers teens an opportunity to gain valuable leadership and service experience. They conduct activities in three areas: Academic success, career exploration and community service. This program gives teens an opportunity to explore new horizons and become part of a team. Keystone members also get the opportunity to attend Regional and National Conferences around the United States.

The Torch Club is a leadership and service club for pre-teens ages nine to 13. Torch Club advisors on staff can help meet the needs of younger adolescents at a critical stage in their development. Torch Club members learn to elect officers and work together to plan and implement activities.

YOUTH OF THE YEAR

Youth of the Year is BGCA's premier youth recognition program for teens. Youth of the Year honors and celebrates teens who exemplify:

- Good Character and Citizenship
- Academic Excellence
- Healthy Living

The Youth of the Year program is used as a year-round tool for fostering young people's character, personal growth and leadership qualities. Our club recognizes a Youth of the Month and selects one as Youth of the Year to participate in the regional state competition. Five regional winners each receive scholarships and compete on the national level. The National Youth of the Year receives an additional scholarships and is installed by the President of the United States as BGCA's national teen spokesperson.

SMART MOVES

This nationally acclaimed comprehensive prevention program helps young people resist alcohol, tobacco and other drug use. Smart Moves features engaging, interactive, small-group activities that increase participants peer support to enhance their life skills. The program encourages collaborations among club staff, youth parents and representatives from other communities. The program's components are: SMART Kids, for ages six to nine, Start SMART for ages 10 to 12, Stay SMART for ages 13 to 15 and SMART Parents. SMART Leaders is a peer leader/booster program for older teens to become mentors with the SMART Moves Program.

TRIPLE PLAY (HEALTHY HABITS)

Empowering youth to eat right is a generation-changing, life-enhancing program goal. Triple Play's nutrition component, called Healthy Habits, covers the poster of choice, calories, vitamins & minerals, the food pyramid and appropriate portion size.

The Healthy Habits program is designed to: Teach young people about the benefits of healthy habits such as eating right and being physically active. Equip young people with skills to adopt healthier habits by participating in fun and engaging learning activities both at the club and at home. Encourage young people to take small steps toward positive behavior changes.
